For having a love of learning and wanting to push herself in all areas of the curriculum.

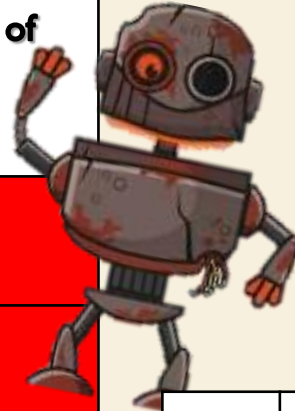
